### Communion Vessels

The Church has always tried to mark the Liturgical seasons in a variety of ways; the most common and most obvious ways are the changes in music and vestment color. Here at Saint Peter's one of the more subtle seasonal changes has been our use of different communion vessels during different times of the year. We have used pottery for the seasons of Advent and Lent, glass for the weeks of Ordinary time and pewter for the days of Christmas and Easter, as well as the major feasts.



Although they have all served us well, many people have had some difficulty drinking from the pewter cups which are deep and narrow. This has at times caused some spillage of Christ's precious blood. Hoping to avoid those accidents in the future, we have found some communion cups with a much wider opening. They are silver plated but would complement the pewter plates and pitcher that we currently have.

As our children will soon be preparing a Christmas wish list, our parish would like to follow their example. If anyone would like to contribute a communion cup or two for our parish, perhaps in memory of a loved one, please talk to Father Tom. The cost of each silver cup is \$600.00. Thank you in advance for your generosity to our parish.
